Our Pillars

To function effectively and efficiently, the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre is built on three fundamental pillars:

Pillar 1: Compassionate, Professional Care for Wild Birds

STRATEGIC STATEMENT

Provide the highest standard of care to wild birds admitted to the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre.

Objectives:

- Invest in continuing education and training for staff and advance the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre's wild bird care procedures and policies through applying or exceeding national and international standards and best practices.
- Maintain all licenses and comply with all laws and regulations required for delivering wild bird care.

Pillar 2: Promote Awareness and Foster Relationships

Promote awareness and foster relationships with the public, communities, schools, academia and the private sector for the protection and care of wild birds.

Objectives:

- Develop and improve strategies to raise public awareness about the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre's important mandate in caring, rehabilitating and releasing wild birds.
- Provide timely, compassionate advice to citizens experiencing a wild bird crisis on the care and safe delivery of the wild bird to the Centre.
- Inform and educate the public on the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre's role in saving wild birds, considering the drastic decline in wild bird populations.
- Collaborate and foster relationships with organizations and academia that share a common goal of protecting and saving injured wild birds.

Ensure the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre is stable, continues to evolve and is supported by a vibrant organization.

Objectives:

- Maintain the required capacity to deliver services through attracting and keeping qualified permanent and part-time staff and dedicated volunteers.
- Ensure organizational policies and systems are in place to support the functioning of the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre, its staff and volunteers.
- Ensure governance documentation, including bylaws and other corporate documents, are up-to-date and the Board of Directors is functioning at a high level.
- Build and relocate to a state-of-the art facility for wild bird care that takes into account environmental and health considerations.
- Ensure the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre's finances are sound and required funding is being sought to sustain the Ottawa Valley Wild Bird Care Centre into the future.
